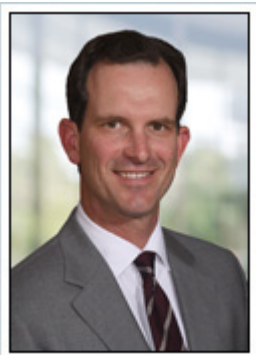


Ralph Rush Jr.
